- 3) The donors can view their donation history on their dashboard.

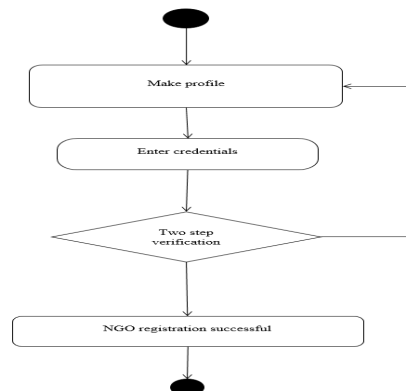


Fig 1. Activity diagram for donor side

- 3) The NGOs can view their monthly donation report on their dashboards.

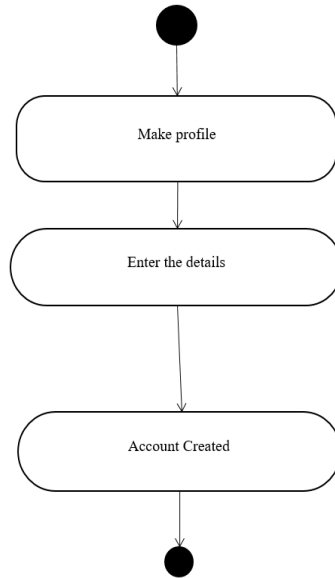


Fig 2. Activity diagram for NGOs
